Connecticut PharmNetEx	PharmNetEx is an independent practice association (IPA) of credentialed pharmacists who provide medication therapy management (MTM) services, medication reconciliation upon care transitions and medication coordination with beneficiaries, primary care providers, and other health care professionals involved in the overall healthcare of the beneficiary.	PharmNetEx has participated in a Medicaid Transformation Grant with the University of Connecticut School of Pharmacy and the State of Connecticut Department of Social Services. The results of this project have been published in the prestigious policy journal Health Affairs in April, 2011. Through a grant with the Center for Technology and Aging in California, PharmNetEx worked with Khmer Health Advocates and community health workers to provide direct patient care MTM services in the elderly Cambodian-American population. Currently pursuing contracts on behalf of its network.
Georgia AIP Select Network	This network consists of 475 independent pharmacies who are members of the Georgia Pharmacy Association's Academy of Independent Pharmacy (AIP). Indiana Indiana Medication Management Partnership (IMMP)	The Indiana Medication Management Partnership (IMMP) is a statewide network of Indiana pharmacists and pharmacies. The mission of IMMP is to provide high value, patient-centered medication therapy management (MTM) services to optimize medication use and improve health outcomes. Pharmacists or pharmacies involved in providing MTM services, as well as payers seeking such services, contract directly with the Purdue University College of Pharmacy. Administrative tasks and evaluation of IMMP are the responsibility of IMMP leadership at the College. IMMP is an engagement program of the Purdue University College of Pharmacy, in cooperation with the Indiana Pharmacists Alliance (IPA).	IMMP is currently seeking pharmacist/pharmacies enrollment and payer contracts.
Maryland P³ Program	The P ³ Program managed by the University of Maryland School of Pharmacy in partnership with the Maryland Pharmacists Association provides comprehensive medication therapy management services to self-funded employers. Improving therapeutic outcomes and reducing healthcare costs have been achieved by improving medication effectiveness and adherence; promoting continuity of care among providers; and supporting patient self-management. 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Minnesota MedEdgeRx	MedEdgeRx is a Minnesota-based medication management network that works very closely with the Minnesota Pharmacists Association. The network was built on the concepts present in the MN Medicaid MTM program, which was established by the MN legislature in 2004. The Network is comprised of credentialed pharmacists who practice in contracted independent, drug and grocery chain, clinic, health-system pharmacies.	Network pharmacists provide comprehensive medication-management services and are compensated on the Network's value/time based fee schedule for services provided. The Network also includes pay-for-value programs in its contracting. The Network uses a Peer Review Panel to review the documentation of the network providers for CQI purposes.
Missouri Pharmacist Care Network	The Missouri Pharmacists Care Network (MO-PCN) is an LLC under the Missouri Pharmacy Association. CPN is the pharmacist network coordinator for South Carolina and has established the Palmetto Pharmacist Network (PPN), the group of pharmacists participating in these programs who are dedicated to its success. Tennessee Patient Care Pharmacists Collaborative	Patient Care Pharmacists Collaborative, Inc., PCPC is a wholly owned entity of the Tennessee Pharmacists Association (TPA). PCPC strives to meet the goals and needs of clients through the creation, development, implementation, and ongoing management of its network of trained and credentialed pharmacist providers.	Pharmacists credentialed through PCPC receive additional skills and training through PCPC which help to ensure that patients receive high quality, consistent pharmacist-provided patient care services, allowing them to achieve their optimal health outcomes and related goals of therapy. Wisconsin Pharmacy Quality Collaborative	WPQC is an initiative of the Pharmacy Society of Wisconsin (PSW) which connects community pharmacists with patients, physicians, and health plans to improve the quality and reduce the cost of medication use across Wisconsin. This team-based approach has brought stakeholders together in a unique collaboration with the goal of ensuring safe and high-quality care to patients in Wisconsin. WPQC coordinates a network of pharmacies with certified pharmacists who have received specific Medication Therapy Management (MTM) training.	WPQC pharmacists meet privately with patients to review medication regimens, communicate potential opportunities to improve medication use with physicians and other health care providers, and educate patients on the appropriate use of their medications. Current activity is with WI Medicaid/Senior Care, Network Health, Unity Health Insurance, UnitedHealthcare – Wisconsin, and United Way of Dane County WPQC received \$4.1 million under the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) Health Care Innovation Award (HCIA) to provide WPQC services to the patients of WI.
