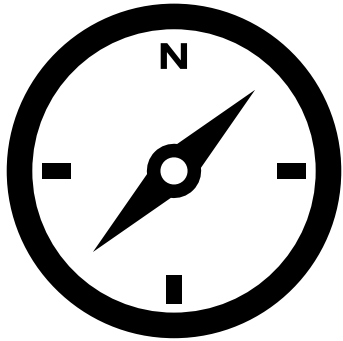

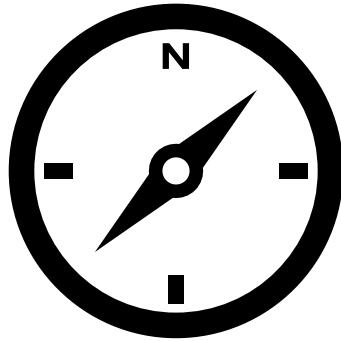
Follow these medication safety tips when you travel:

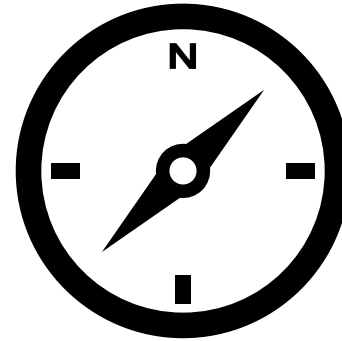

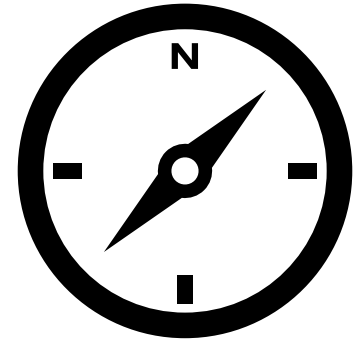
